### Moran Wants \$12,000

William Gibson, matchmaker of the Garden A. C. New York, will give one more opportunity to Frank Moran to come to terms for a return match with Jim Coffey.

Gibson's best offer to date has been \$8,000 for Moran's end. The Pittsburgher at first asked \$12,000. In the last week he has pared \$300 from this demand. Gibson meanwhile had added \$500 to the offers that started at \$5,000. It would come as no great surprise if the interested parties were to split the difference. That would assure Moran \$10,000 for his end—a tidy sum indeed for ten rounds with a man he knocked out so easily a few weeks ago.
