ALARMING INCREASE OF DRUNKENNESS

Arrests in Montreal Have More Than Doubled in Last Two Years—Court Officials Give Comparisons

(Montreal Herald) Is drunkenness on the increase in Montreal? It is not only on the increase, but it is doubling its influence every twelve months?

The average Montrealese, asked such a question, would probably say: "I don't think it is increasing much."

"No ordinary observer would imagine that drunkenness had doubled its grip on the city between 1908 and 1909, and that it had a gain of fifty per cent since last year.

Yet the figures showing the number of convictions for drunkenness show an increasing ratio in those proportions.

With the increase of population and also with the arrival of the summer floating population, the number of "drunks" goes on increasing steadily in the Recorder's Court.

This number does not include the "delirium tremens" cases, the insanity cases, and most of the assault cases, all, or nearly all, having their origin in the drinking habit.

Corresponding week last year: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday.

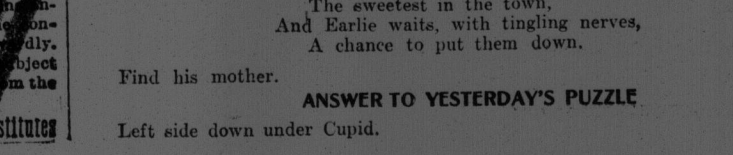
Some week in 1908: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday.
