LIABILITIES AND REVENUE.

The total liabilities of the province are placed at \$37,999,814.94, according to the balance sheet. Current liabili-ties are placed at \$3,193,758.74. The consolidated balance sheet places the liabilities at \$36,094,802.19. For the fiscal year the total revenue is shown as \$4,154,780.45. The largest item of revenue is that from lands and mines, a total of \$1,213,396.49. Miscellaneous collections totalled \$707,-080.82.


From the New Brunswick Liquor Commission receipts totalled \$329. 114,07, and those from motor vehicle fees \$500,592.58. The Liquor Commis-sion and the Department of Lands and Mines produced less revenue than in the year before, the receipts for that year being respectively \$490,195.34 and \$1,371,272.82. Motor vehicles fees and miscellaneous collections through the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer's De-partment totalled, for 1924, \$450,571.18 and \$601,498.15, increasing last year. HEAVIEST EXPENDITURES.

The heaviest expenditures during the year were made in the Department of Public Works, where \$1,010,229.30 was spent, an increase of about \$87,-000. The Department of Education drew \$448,116.19 from the public purse with \$55,109.92 in addition for voce-tional education. Legislation cost \$72,313.18 and the Department of Ag-riculture, \$125,561.02. On the Depart-ment of Lands and Mines the expen-diture was \$204,829.42, and on Public Health, \$102,152.37. With some few exceptions the expenditures in the de-partments were larger than the year before.
