Communication with nearly thirty northwestern Oklahoma and western Texas towns has been cut. Woodward and Blair, Oklahoma, are completely isolated and other towns are without telephone facilities. Some of them have been without train service for more than three days. Airplane mall service to Blair has been authorized.
