

### Wedded In Jest; Repent at Leisure

50 Judge Rules in Denying West  
Virginia Joy Riders Divorce

Morgantown, W. Va., June 11. — Judge L. G. Lasselle refused to divorce Jamison Meredith, a West Virginia University student, and his wife, Anne Shakespeare Meredith, on the ground that they contracted the marriage in a "spirit of jest." The case will go to the Supreme Court.

"I am unable to believe," Judge Lasselle said, "that a young man and a young woman of the education and Christian rearing of these two could have heard the ceremony read and participated in it with any spirit of fun or with any intention other than of becoming man and wife."

"There is no doubt in my mind that these two were in love, although I fear that this love has been turned to hate on at least one side and cannot be revived."

According to the testimony, Meredith, who is a son of Supreme Court Judge J. A. Meredith of Fairmount, went on an automobile trip with a party of friends which included Miss Shakespeare. They decided to get married, and the ceremony was performed by the Rev. John A. Volen-wierder of the Methodist Episcopal Church. He testified that there was no spirit of jest by either of the contracting parties.



**KLONDYKE PIONEER  
IS DEAD IN N. S.**

Montreal, June 10.—A telegram was received today by R. W. Gould, secretary of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association here, announcing the death of Mrs. Gould's father, John Power, of Stollarton, N.S., who died there early this morning, after a prolonged illness.  
The late Mr. Power was a well-known lumber operator in connection with the coal mining industry of Pictou county, N.S., having been for many years connected with the Intercolonial Coal Mining Company and the Acadia Coal Company.  
He was a native of Sydney, N.S., and was one of the pioneers in the original Klondyke rush, spending several years in the Klondyke gold country. He returned without locating any rich finds and was for some time connected with gold mining enterprises at County Harbor, N.S.
