

## COURT HELD IN DITCH AT MIDNIGHT

Dispensing justice from the roadside near Norton at the weird hour of 1 o'clock last Monday morning, Magistrate Herbert J. Anderson, of Renfrew, imposed a fine of \$25 and costs on John F. Lorraine of New Bedford (Mass.), for driving on the Routhway road and failing to stop when ordered by constables to do so.

Several other speeders and offenders against the traffic laws have been fined within the last few days. Magistrate Allingham, of Fairville, on June 17, fined one man \$2 for driving without a license tag; on June 22, he fined two speeders \$3 each, and on June 23, two more \$5 each.

Magistrate Anderson, of Renfrew, fined one man \$15 on June 21 for leaving a dealer's tag, and another \$10 for speeding on the Routhway road. Yesterday he fined three more speeders \$3 each and one charge for speeding was withdrawn when the driver showed he was going for a doctor.

Another speeding case involving two lawyers was supposed to have come up before Magistrate Anderson last evening but was postponed until Tuesday because one of the men could not attend.

## WOMAN DROWNED IN A WELL. Husband Plunges In To Save Her and Ho, Too, Almost Loses Life.

Newton, N. J., June 25.—In an effort to rescue his wife, who had fallen into a twenty-five foot well on their farm, Frank Gillen, thirty-eight years of age, was nearly drowned. When rescued he was exhausted and nearly unconscious. Physicians were not able to revive the woman.

Gillen had been making some repairs to the well, and his wife, who had recently been ill, was watching him. He went to the barn, and when he returned he saw her struggling in the twelve feet water. Gillen called for help, then jumped into the well. He succeeded in helping his wife, but he himself was nearly drowned. He was rescued by a neighbor, a passing baker, heard him and went to the rescue.

Mrs. Gillen, who was about thirty-five years old, is believed to have lost her sense when looking into the well.

## PLOWMAN AT NEWBURG. N. Y. FINDS BONES OF A GIANT MASTODON

Newburg, N. Y., June 25.—The skeleton of a mastodon, with tusks seventy-five inches long, has been discovered here by Anthony Fichera, a truck gardener, while plowing on his farm. The bones were in a good state of preservation.

One of the ribs measured fifty inches along the curve and forty-three inches from tip to tip in a straight line. The lower jawbone was thirty-two inches long and the thigh forty-eight inches.

A peculiarity was the size of the thigh joint—a ball of bone fourteen inches in diameter. Each jawbone held three teeth, the enamel still being in good condition. Each tooth was fourteen inches long and the combined width of the three measured sixteen inches.

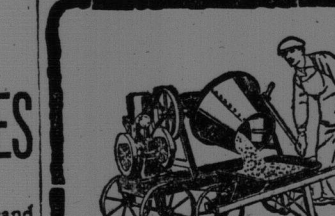

## ADMIRAL SIMS IS GIVEN REPRIMAND

(Canadian Press Dispatch)

Washington, June 23.—Secretary of the Navy Denby today "publicly" reprimanded Rear Admiral William S. Sims, as a result of the speech of the admiral made in London June 7, in which he criticised Sinn Féin sympathizers in America.

In the reprimand, Mr. Denby pointed out that once before the navy department had found it necessary to take similar action against the officer for a speech delivered in London in 1911, and referring to the text of that reprimand, added:

"Your remarks on the occasion now under discussion therefore constitute a flagrant and deliberate disregard of specific instructions."

While the naval secretary was making public the reprimand Admiral Sims was calling on President Harding at the White House. It was explained that the admiral called to leave his card as the custom when high naval officers return from a trip abroad, but that the president invited him to chat for a few minutes.

Upon leaving the White House, Admiral Sims, referring to the reprimand, said: "I got what I deserved, the same old thing."

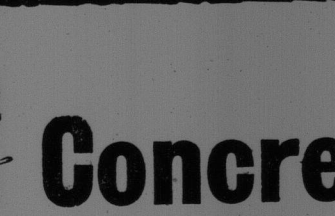
