Ottawa, Nov. 25—While the national executive of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association has been urging on the government all day its views as to the necessity of having a permanent tariff commission, members of the executive said afterwards that their idea was simply that such a commission should be of advisory character. They had no desire that the personnel of such a committee should be drawn from any particular class, or that such a body should usury any of the functions of the ministers or of parliament. They felt, however, that the minister of finance should have to assist him a board of experts who would give their time and brains to the study of trade conditions and the best scientific means of adjusting it or revising it to meet any general or special conditions arising from time to time. All their recommendations would be subject to confirmation by the government.

The future developments in which the N. S. Power Commission will figure, and the place to be taken in what goes on by the N. S. Tramways Company and the city of Halifax, will be watched with a considerable degree of interest, not only in this city but by a wide circle of observers in other parts of the country. It will be Nova Scotia's first experiment in municipal ownership of water powers.

The commissioners have another source of power under consideration, of which it has made some preliminary investigation. It is at Sheet Harbor, where they may do the same thing for New Glasgow and mining towns in Pictou that they propose for Halifax. There is a stretch of about ninety miles of transmission for this power, and the question is whether hydro-electric energy at that distance would be as economical as power generated on a large scale from slack coal at the mines. This is a problem to be solved, but it would appear to be the general opinion that the hydro-electric energy would be the cheaper of the two, even at the handicap of a long mileage in transmission.




Wisdom Preserved the World
