## Hints for the Cook

## Jellied Prunes

Soak 1-2 box of gelatin in 1-2 cup of cold water. Dissolve in 2 cups of hot water in which the prunes were cooked. Add 1-4 cup of lemon juice, 1-4 cups sugar, strain and add 1-2 pound of prunes, cooked, stored and halved. Set away to harden. You may use cream on it, sometimes soft custard and sometimes whipped cream.

## Rye Muffins

Rye flour 1 cup, white flour 1 cup, 2 tablespoons sugar, salt to your taste, 1 cup milk, 1 egg, 2 teaspoons baking powder. Mix all dry ingredients thoroughly. Beat your egg, then add milk. Stir dry ingredients in. Batter or lard your greases. Bake 20 to 25 minutes in hot oven.

## Apple Fritters

Core, pare and slice one large apple, sprinkle with two tablespoons of powdered sugar, 1-2 teaspoon of cinnamon, a grating of nutmeg and the juice of half a lemon, and let stand half an hour. Beat two eggs lightly, add 1-2 cup of milk and one teaspoon of melted butter, then stir in one cup of flour and beat until perfectly smooth. Dip the prepared apples in the batter, fry in deep fat, and drain on brown paper before serving.

## Sardine Filling

Three sliced breakfast bacon, fried crisp, add a hard boiled egg and chop fine, add 2 tablespoons of cold baked beans mashe fine, add 2 tablespoons of salad dressing or mustard vinegar, and mix thoroughly.

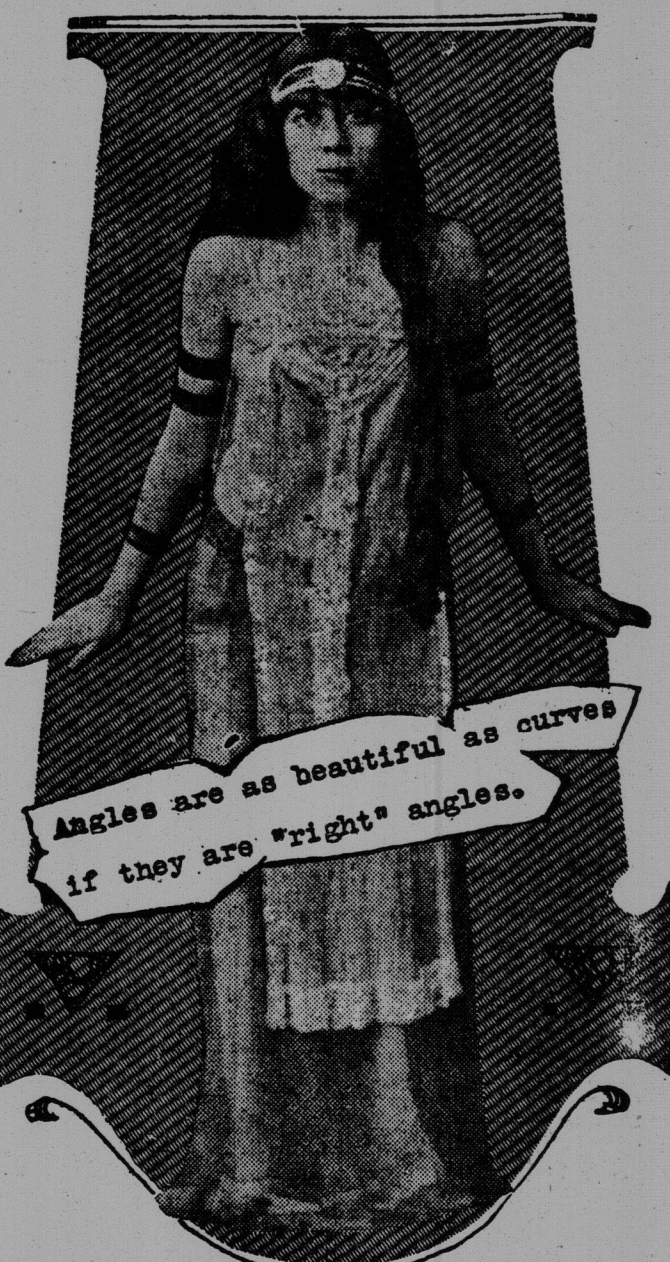

A bulletin entitled "The Planting and Care of Shade Trees" has just been issued by the Central Experimental Farm. This publication, which has been pre-

pared by F. E. Buck, B. S. A., assistant to the dominion horticulturist, contains practical directions and advice in the selection of shade trees, their planting, transplanting and subsequent treatment and care, with notes on the principal injuries and unfavorable conditions to which shade trees are subjected, especially in towns and cities. Lists of

varieties suitable for street and home planting are also given.
