TWO BRANCHES OF C. M. B. A. PREPARE FOR ANNIVERSARIES

Numbers 133 and 134 Are To Celebrate Next Week

A Glance Backward to the Time of Organization—Four Branches Now in City With Some 800 Members

Two of the branches of the C. M. B. A. in the city, 133 and 134 will celebrate the twenty-third anniversary of their founding on Tuesday and Wednesday next, May 21 and May 22. Both are in a very satisfactory condition, with increasing membership, and bright prospects. The members of the city branch, 134, will observe their anniversary with a smoker at which a programme of music, drama and other amusements will be enjoyed. Of the several who formed the membership on the charter roll, few are now surviving either in the Carleton or city branch, but those who are still numbered as charter members retain the hearty interest and activity which they displayed on joining. It was in 1890 that several Catholic men met in the office of Hon. John L. Carleton, then a rising young barrister, and now judge of the county court of Carleton county and discussed the matter of introducing a Catholic benefit association into the city. A few of the bodies then in existence had a sick benefit, but none provided for insurance protection. The Catholic Union in Carleton had for years labored to provide such a scheme, but for various reasons had failed, at the meeting in question it was decided to establish a branch of the C. M. B. A. here. T. P. Tansey, of Montreal, was delegated to come here and on May 28 instituted branch 133 in Carleton, with about 800 members, with branch 134 leading with nearly 400. More than 75,000 death claims have been paid to widows or orphans of deceased members. The organization has been heartily endorsed and supported by the hierarchy of the church, many of whom are enrolled upon its membership register, and branch 134 has the distinction of the membership of His Grace, Archbishop Casey, His Lordship Bishop LeBlanc, and nearly all the priests of the diocese. It is now in a state of health and prosperity and since January alone its numbers have been swelled by more than forty. The lecture series instituted a couple of years ago and continued by the branch has been effective in keeping it prominently before the public, and the reputation of the lectures with the excellence of their subjects have greatly tended to cultivate one of the chief objects of the association, the advancement of the intellectual interests of the members. The smoker to be held on Wednesday evening next is expected to be well attended, and the committee in charge, the chairman of which is Louis E. McDonald, is making every effort to have it a success.

VALLEY RAILROAD STATION.

The plans for eighteen station houses, between Gagetown and Centreville, on the St. John Valley Railway, are on file in Woodstock. They are for good substantial buildings. There will be two better station houses at Woodstock and Centreville, the plans for which are not yet ready. It is expected that work will be commenced on the station houses not later than August 1.

Daily Hints For the Cook

MACARONI A LA ROYAL

Cook half a package of macaroni in boiling salted water until tender, drain, pour 2 quarts of cold water over it and drain again. Season ½ can of tomatoes with 1 tablespoon of sugar, ½ teaspoon of curry powder, ¼ teaspoon of white pepper and a dash of cayenne and cook 5 minutes. Have ready 1 cup of American cheese cut into dice, 1½ cups of stuffed olives and ¼ cup of butter cut into bits. Butter a baking dish, fill with alternate layers of macaroni, tomatoes, cheese, olives and crumbs, finish with a top layer of crumbs, dot with the butter and bake until brown.
