6th. Voted, That the Baptist-Missionary Board for the present year, stand as before.

7th. Voted, That the Correspondence be continued with Sister Associations in the State of Maine and Nova Scotia, by Minutes and Messengers.

8th. Voted, That Elder WILLIAM SEARS be our Messenger to Sister Association in Nova Scotia, and that the sum of £4 be given to defray his expences, and in case of failure that he appoint a substitute.

9th. Voted, That the Association be held at Fredericton, on the third Monday after the 20th June, 1832.

10th. Voted, That Elder WILLIAM SEARS preach the Introductory Sermon next year. In case of failure, Elder DAVID CRANDALL.

11th. Voted, That Elder JOSEPH CRANDALL write the Circular, and Elder TITUS STONE the Corresponding Letter.

12th. Voted, That Brother JAMES HOLMAN superintend the printing of the Minutes, and that 600 copies be printed.

13th. Voted, That a day of Fasting and Prayer be recommended to be observed on the 1st day of January, 1832; as also the Monthly Missionary Prayer Meetings.

14th. Voted, That the business of printing the Nova-Scotia and New-Brunswick Baptist Missionary Magazine, in Halifax, Nova-Scotia, be referred to the Baptist Missionary Board in St. John, New-Brunswick.

15th. Voted, That our General Meeting be held at the Baptist Meeting-House, in Springfield, the 1st Saturday in October next. The Ministering Brethren are particularly invited to attend.

16th. Voted, That the rules of the Nova-Scotia Baptist Association be accepted and observed hereafter.
