THE EXHIBITION.

VISITED BY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL AND SUITE YESTERDAY.

Sir John A. Macdonald Three Today.

The weather yesterday was St. John.

Exhibition weather as it is today and

has been since the great show opened.

Everybody enjoys an exhibition in

this weather. The governor general

did. After the levee at four o'clock

yesterday he visited the buildings, and

seemed greatly pleased with everything

he saw. He was received by

President C. A. Everett, and in

a neat speech thanked him and the

committee for their attention and

wished them all success in this and

future exhibitions. The attendance

yesterday was 4,254 persons. The attend-

ance today was large and Sir John A.

Macdonald, Canada's great leader, was

among the number. He was received

with an address which together

with his reply will be found

in another column.

THE SPECIAL ATTRACTION FOR TO-DAY

will be the fireworks at nine o'clock

comprising the following items:

1. Illumination of grounds with pri-

mate colored lights.

2. Flight of silver streamers.

3. Flight of balloons.

4. Set piece. The Indian star with re-

volving cent of saucers and fairy

snakes.

5. Set piece. The royal star, 20 feet

in diameter, with 200 stars.

6. Set piece. Silver palm trees, revolv-

ing.

7. Mechanical piece. See-saw in mo-

tion.

8. Golden fountain, revolving cent

of stars.

9. Motto, Success to the C. I. E. and

Good Bye.

The attendance at the exhibition this

morning was much larger than on any

morning this week. This is scarcely

to be wondered at as it was generally

known that Canada's greatest statesman

was to pay the exhibition a visit during

the morning and to be the recipient of an

address.

At 11 o'clock Sir John the Governor's

couch containing Sir John Macdonald, Sir

Leonard Tilley, Mr. C. A. Everett and Mr.

W. M. Jarvis arrived in front of the main

entrance to the Exhibition grounds where

the distinguished visitor was presented

to the directors of the association. After

this ceremony Sir John, with the gov-

ernor on his right and the president of

the association on his left, entered the

building through the main door. Here

they were met by a considerable crowd

anxious to see the premier.

Almost immediately after the arrival

of the premier, Hon. G. F. Foster, Sir

John Thompson, and Hon. C. H. Tupper,

accompanied by several local politicians,

arrived at the entrance of the building

and soon joined the other party, the

summit being inspected by the

exhibits. An hour was spent in this

waiting for the mayor who was in the
