SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Domi- nion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 1 and 26, not reser- ved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for homestead entry must be made in person by the applicant at the office of the local Agent or Sub-Agent. Entry by proxy may, however, be made on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother, or sister of an intending homesteader.

An application for entry or inspection made personally at any Sub-Agent's office may be wired to the local agent by the Sub-Agent, at the expense of the ap- plicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such applica- tion is to have priority, and the land will be held until the necessary papers to com- plete the transaction are received by mail.

In case of "personation" the entry will be summarily cancelled and the applicant will forfeit all rights of claim.

An application for inspection must be made personally at any Sub-Agent's office, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such applica- tion is to have priority, and the land will be held until the necessary papers to com- plete the transaction are received by mail.

In case of "personation" the entry will be summarily cancelled and the applicant will forfeit all rights of claim.

Where an entry is summarily cancelled, or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent institution of cancellation proceedings, until prior right of entry, will be en- titled to prior right of entry.

Applicants for inspection must state in what particular the entry is made in default, and if subsequently the state- ment found to be untrue, the applicant, in particular, the applicant will lose any prior right of re-entry, should the land become vacant, or if entry has been granted it may be summarily cancelled.

A CUTLER-A settler is required to per- form the conditions under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is dead) of a homesteader re- sides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such homesteader the requirement as to residence may be sat- isfied by such person residing with the father (or mother).

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirement may be satisfied by residence upon such land.

Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Domi- nion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST MINING REGULATIONS.

COAL-Mining rights may be leased for a period of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,500 acres shall be leased to one individual or company. The royalty at the rate of five cents per ton shall be collected on the merchantable coal mined.

CLAIMS-A person, eighteen years of age, or over, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 150' x 1,500 feet.

The fee for recording a claim is \$10. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in full therefor. When \$200 has been expended or paid, the locator may, upon making a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, pur- chase the land \$1 per acre.

The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 2% per cent. on the sales. Placer mining claims generally are 300 feet square; entry fee \$5, renewable yearly.

An applicant may obtain two leases to dredge for gold of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior.

The lease holder has the right of ex- traction within one season from the date of the lease for each five miles. Rental \$10 per annum for each mile of five leased. Royalty at the rate of 2% per cent. on the output after it exceeds \$10,000.
