THE CONDUCT OF THE STRIKE.

To the Editor of the Star:
Dear Sir--Along with the majority I
rejoice that the differences between the
shipbuilders and the steamship com-
panies are settled, though I am sorry
the men did not receive the thirty-five
cents they asked, which was none too
much considering the labor exposure
to cold and storm, the danger from
accidents and the lost time. The men are
to be congratulated that not one mem-
ber of their association was arrested
during the strike for drunkenness or
any act of lawlessness. Citizens of St.
John of all trades have reason to be
proud of that fact. Think of it--a
body of about one thousand men de-
cide to go on strike, and do so; and
after two weeks not a break in the
ranks, not one scab, not one act of
lawlessness. This is simply unparallel-
led in the annals of labor strikes.

Sir, I would like to ask, Did this hard-
working, law-abiding number of tax-
paying intelligent citizens receive jus-
tice by those in authority? Did Chief
Clark and his police officers exceed
their authority when they boarded the
C. P. R. train at Fairville, which is
outside the city limits? Did they assist
the C. P. R. detectives to keep the

directed and assisted the steamship of-
ficials in compelling the unwilling and
timid Italians to board the steamer, and

ing actually shoved a man in the direction
of the steamer, do you not think that
there is room for an investigation?
Why could not the "longshoremen
who tried to get a warrant for the C.
P. R. detective who pointed the revolver
and found some one who had jurisdic-
tion?"
If it was one of the laborers who had
done the revolver pointing the C. P. R.
R. would easily have got a warrant.
Why cannot the city council and the
government who built the wharves with
the people's money stipulate that the
work should be done by local or at least
competent men? The freight which
the strike-breakers took from the steam-
ers and wharves. If the "longshoremen
would do that they would quickly hear
about it.
