Committee to Prepare for the Coming Conference

Judge Forbes and Dr. Magill the Delegates From the Maritime Provinces to the Session in Philadelphia.

Hon. J. G. Forbes leaves tomorrow evening for Philadelphia, where he will attend a meeting of the executive committee of the eastern section of the Pan-Presbyterian conference.
