SWIMS ENGLISH CHANNEL AFTER 24-HOUR STRUGGLE.

T. W. Burgess, a Yorkshire man, after nine unsuccessful attempts, finally succeeded in swimming the English Channel from Dover to Cape Gris Nez. It took the plucky swimmer twenty-four hours to negotiate the narrow but dangerous span of water between the French and English coasts.

Numerous attempts have been made to swim the Channel since 1875, when Captain Matthew Webb swam from Dover to Calais in twenty-one hours and forty-five minutes, but no one has been able to duplicate Captain Webb's feat until Burgess accomplished it.
