The Department of Trade and Commerce at Ottawa has just issued a statement which shows the great development of trade interests between the Dominio: a Canada and those of the West Indian Islands which came under the 1912 reciprocal trade agreement effected by Sir George E. Foster. Canada's exports of lumber increased 26 per cent., as against a decrease in American exports of lumber amounting to 66 per cent.
