(1) By erasing the names of the
charter members mentioned in page
one (1) and substituting therefor the
names of five (5) other persons as
charter members.

(2) By substituting for the Provi-
sional Directors mentioned in Section
Eight (8) of said Act, the names of the

(3) By incorporating in the said
Act the Provisions of the New Brun-
swick Companies' Act, 1916, so far as
the same may be consistent there-
with.

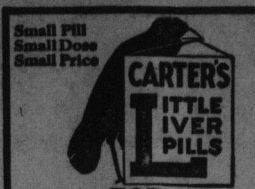
