Joy For the Wets.
The S. S. Manchester Merchant,
which entered port yesterday with a
diversified cargo, carried 150 cases of
Scotch whiskey among the other "per-
ishables" on board.

Here From Iceland.
The Icelandic schooner Ensign, from
Sigliffjord, arrived in port yesterday
from Metoqhan, where she had been
undergoing repairs. She will load
lumber here for the Canary Islands.

Brought Molasses.
The schooner Rose Murphy and the
Lucy Evelyn, which arrived yesterday
from Barbados, brought cargoes of
2,849 puns and tierces of molasses for
this port.

The auxiliary schooner Quaco Queen
has finished loading, but is having her
rigging and sails overhauled before
making her maiden voyage, lumber
laden, for Ireland.

Reached Halifax.
The R. M. S. P. Chaleur, which
sailed from this port Saturday morn-
ing, arrived at Halifax Sunday, where
she will complete loading for the West
Indies.


