B. in Charlottetown P.E. Island, 7 June 1835. Ed. at Central Academy. M. at Pownal, 3 August 1869, Amelia M. dan. of Mr. John Ings. First elected for present seat at g.e. 1870, and again in 1872, when at formation of the Haythorne-Palmer Govt, was appointed a member of Ex. Council, which he resigned in January 1873.
