An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of money required for defraying certain expenses of the Civil Government for the year 1865, and for certain other purposes connected with the Public Service.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN

THEREAS it appears by Messages from His Excellency the Right Honorable Charles Stanley Viscount Monck, Governor General of British North America, and Captain General and Governor in Chief in and over this Province of 5 Canada, and the Estimates accompanying the same, that the sums dereinafter mentioned are required to defray certain expenses of the Oivil Government of this Province not otherwise provided for, for the remainder of the present financial year, and for the first attacker of that next ensuing, and other 10 purposes connected; with the Public Service :-- May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted, by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, that-

- 1. From and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of this Province there shall and may be paid and applied, a sum not exceeding in the wholesthree millions, three hundred and eighty thousand dollars, for the several purposes mentioned in the schedule to this Act.
- 2. The due application of the moneys hereby appropriated shall be accounted for to Her Mujesty, Her Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of Hor Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as Her Majesty, fler Heirs and Successors shall direct.
- 3. A detailed account of the moneys expended under the authority of this Act, shall be laid before the Legislative Assembly of this Province, during the first fifteen days of the Session of the Provincial Parliament next after such expendifure.
