



College survey: unisex hair styles -not unisex prices

A group of first year Erindale College sociology students question the logic of unisex hairstyling salons charging different prices for males and females. They contacted unisex salons in

Mississauga, Toronto and Hamilton, and discovered that although a few salons charged a unisex price, the average cost to a girl with short hair for cut and styling is \$10. The average price for a male with shoulder length hair to have his tresses

cut and styled, is an average of \$7 or \$8.

According to spokesman for the group, Sue Ralph, the same techniques and same equipment are used, and the price differential depends on your sex.
