County proposal: tatoo dogs for identification

Peel County will recommend to all counties in Ontario that a tatooing scheme for the identification of dogs be Chinguacousy Reeve, Robert Williams; a vetrinarian, has presented a proposal to general com-mittee of county council recommending that council pass a by-law making it mandatory for all dogs to be tatooed before three months of age by a veterinarian or by the Humane Society.

Dogs brought into the county after the initial threemonth period that are not tatooed would also have to be

With this process it would take approximately six to eight years before all dogs were tatooed, but its prime purpose would be accomplished much earlier as most dogs that go "bad" or cause damage to liv stock and wildlife are usually in the one-year to three-year age group, Williams said.
