County proposal: tatoo dogs for identification

Peel County will recommend to all counties in Ontario that a tatooing scheme for the identification of dogs be adopted as soon as possible. Chinguacousy Reeve, Robert Williams, a veterinarian, has presented a proposal to general committee of county council recommending that council pass a by-law making it mandatory for all dogs to be tatooed before three months of age by a veterinarian or by the Humane Society.

Dogs brought into the county after the initial three-month period that are not tatooed would also have to be done.

With this process it would take approximately six to eight years before all dogs were tatooed, but its prime purpose would be accomplished much earlier as most dogs that go "bad" or cause damage to livestock and wildlife are usually in the one-year to three-year age group, Williams said. He suggested that all puppies born after the passing of the by-law be

tatooed either in the right ear or right flank using the standard Ketchum dog tatoo.

The County would have printed duplicate numbered certificates which would be issued by the vet or Humane Society official to the owner. The duplicate would be sent to the county along with a suggested 50 cent registration fee.

Purebred dogs already tatooed through the Canadian Kennel Club would be registered with their own tatoo numbers on a blank form.

Older dogs could be tatooed at the owner's discretion, but it would not be mandatory.

Besides providing for identification of dogs that are running at large and destroying livestock and wildlife, tatooing would mean rapid identification of lost dogs, preventing household pets from being used for experimental purposes, Williams claimed. It would eliminate dog-napping by suppliers of dogs for research and experimental purposes.

General committee was receptive to his scheme and will have staff contact all other Ontario counties for their views.

Personal notification to all dog owners of rabies clinics in times of rabies outbreaks could be made.

The proposed system would mean rapid calculation of municipal dog population for dog tax purposes and an up-to-date mailing list of dog owners for the same purpose.

Dogs injured or killed in accidents could be quickly identified.

Suggested fees for tatooing and registration would be \$2.50 per dog, Williams said. Older dogs that had to be tatooed because they were brought into the county might need tranquilizing which would cost more than the basic \$2 charged for puppies.

Williams suggested that if other counties or municipalities or the Ontario Humane Society were enlisted into the scheme, a central registry could be set up.

General committee was receptive to his scheme and will have staff contact all other Ontario counties for their views.

Lottery winner hasn't received prize money

STREETSVILLE — Four year old Julie Ann Lauzon still has not received a penny of the \$10,000 she won as second prize in Hamilton Junior Chamber of Commerce's Astro Turf Lottery held Labour Day.

The Jaycees have refused to give the prize money as Julie Ann is not 18 years of age or over, the legal age

they claim for accepting prize money.

Her ticket was bought by her father, an assembly line worker and apartment superintendent.

Mrs. Lauzon told The Times the family have hired a lawyer to represent them in attaining the money.

"Our lawyer has written to the Jaycees but we haven't

had any reply yet. If this doesn't work we will have to take them to court.

"We won't know anything until December at least."

Mrs. Lauzon, who is expecting her third child next summer said the family hoped to buy a home with the winnings.

"With three children the family will just be too big for a two bedroom apartment."

She said the family was "frustrated"; with the legal delays in receiving the money.

Port Credit election Dec. 11

PORT CREDIT — Tomorrow's provincial election has held the limelight for the past month and a half but a municipal election in Port Credit is just around the corner.

Town councillors approved a by-law Monday night that designates Friday Nov. 26 as nomination night and

Saturday Dec. 11 as election day for the Public Utilities Commission and council.

So far none of the seven members on council including Mayor Cy Sadlington have indicated their political intentions and no citizen has revealed his firm ambition to unseat existing councillors.

Local realtor Terry Butt told The Times he was considering running for a council seat. He admitted he had strong feelings on what could have been done to develop the town over the past two years. He also said the council had a stuffy image that some relative youth might help to erase.

Police say, Tommy was walking his bicycle along Bloor Street when he cut out across the road from behind a parked car.

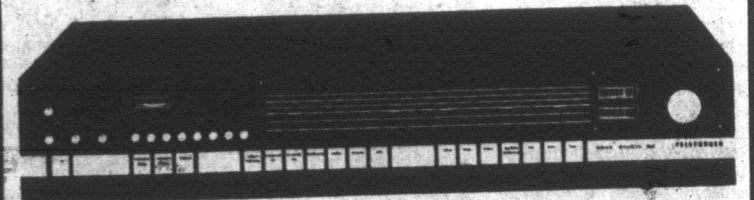
