Uplands, Ontario	September 1, 1944		Weather partly cloudy, very hazy. Flying commenced at 0900 hours and washed out at 1730 hours, dual only. Regular Friday night dance held in the Recreation Hall and attended by many airmen, airwomen and guests from Ottawa.	
	September 2, 1944		Overcast, low clouds, showers. Flying for part of the day only. Wing Commander Eric Webster, A.F.C., and Mr. Leon visited this Unit on their way to Air Force Headquarters. Regular Saturday night movie well attended.	
	September 3, 1944		Open House. Open air concert held in the Pine Grove, music provided by the Army Band from Lansdowne Park. Swimming Pool was open all day for guests. Movies at the Recreation Hall in the evening.	
	September 4, 1944		Partly cloudy. Flying for part of the day only. Inter-service sports meet at Lansdowne Park. Uplands team finished in second place, only four points behind the winning Petawawa team.	
	September 5, 1944		Cloudy to overcast. A full day's flying put in by personnel of Training Wing. F/L E.A. Cullinane (R.C. Padre) reported to this Unit replacing F/L Belanger who has been posted to the Far East.	
	September 6, 1944		Partly cloudy, patches of ground fog. A full day's flying. U202107, LAC Strong, W.G., was killed in an aeroplane crash one mile north of Montebello, Quebec. "A" category crash. Cause obscure. Accident to be investigated by W/C K.C. Rappell from Air Force Headquarters. Wing Officer Walker from A.F.H.Q. visited this Unit. She visited the W.D. Barracks and Canteen and various sections, and commented upon the cleanliness and attractiveness of the Barracks and Canteen, also the deportment of the airwomen at work.	
	September 7, 1944		Rain showers, partly cloudy. Flying for most of the day. F/L Keiler, Command Personnel Counsellor, visit Uplands. Body of LAC Strong, killed September 6th in a crash, was sent to Montreal under escort for burial.	
	September 8, 1944		Overcast, showers. Four hours' flying only. Wings Ceremony of Course 101; G/C W.R. Kingsland, Commanding Officer, presented Wings to graduates. Many guests, friends and relatives of the members of Course 101, were on hand.
