the Commission to avoid being bound by this contract, as it is entirely possible, that rather than face a long and expensive law-suit, the Company would be prepared to compromise by bringing the contract to an end at the expiration of the current five-year period, which is May, 1938. This is particularly so, because the Coniagas Reduction Company has not yet re-opened its plant.

Pending a definite decision by the Commission, however, I would be glad to have the Commission's instructions as to whether we should return the cheque of the Coniagas Company as suggested by Mr. Tilley.
