MAT IS THE MISSION

The three Councils listed at the head of this sheet are promoting a great North American Home Missions Congress which is to be held in Washington, D.C., December 1-5, 1930. Extensive preparations have been under way for three years for this Congress. The twenty-eight denominations with thirty-seven national home mission boards constituent to the Home Missions Council are in this movement, including the United States and Canada. This is the first time an interdenominational and international Congress of home missions has ever been attempted in the United States. It gives promise of marking an epoch in home mission work and we believe it will eventually rank in importance along with Stockholm, Lausanne and Jerusalem.

If we succeed in securing Mr. Rockefeller, we may ask you two men to occupy one evening.
