party. The people have a right to know what kind of government they are going to get if they vote in a certain way.

They know the record of the present
administration; they know that it is composed of
men of integrity, ability, vision, and energy; they
know, too, that it has a coherent, stable following
in the country. We do not have to make unnatural
alliances with people of diverse or divergent political
views.
