
These were small concrete forts partially sunk in the soil and heavily armed, containing 20 to 40 men with machine guns; many examples of which can still be seen dotting the Salient.

But besides their great strength in proportion to their size the pill-boxes possessed the inestimable advantage of being capable of rapid construction. It was only necessary to set up the steel frame work during the night, and fill it up

with concrete three feet thick. Moreover they were thus invulnerable to field guns, and, owing to their small size, a bad target for heavy artillery.
