

FOREIGN MISSIONS

In the midst of universal political unrest the Christian propaganda remains practically undisturbed.

CHINA:—It was reported last year that Japan and India were in the midst of a three-year evangelistic campaign. Christians in China are more ambitious. They have undertaken a *Five Year Campaign* with the objective of presenting the Gospel message to the last man. Think of it! The last man in a population of 400,000,000! Who ventures to say it cannot be done in the face of the promise, "Lo, I am with you always." In our own Honan Mission *the first week*, they enlisted 979 workers, 780 places were visited, *62,272 persons heard the message*, and 606 resolved to become Bible readers.

An appeal from the British Legation to officer a Chinese battalion for France was irresistible. Missionaries alone knew the Chinese language, and fifteen responded. They are missionaries still to the Chinese but in France for the present.

China, so often on the ragged edge of political revolution, has a wonderful power of righting herself without bloodshed. She will some day help to right the world.
