Extracts from P. E. Island Act to prevent disorderly riding, and to regulate the driving of carriages on the streets and public roads.

SECTION 3. All and every person or persons who shall hereafter drive any sleigh, or any truck, cart or chaise, or wheel carriage whatsoever, within any town, or on any of the highways in this Island, shall drive the same in a moderate and careful manner.

SECTION 4. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons, travelling with empty sleds, to suffer pointed stakes to remain standing, or carry frames or projecting pieces, outside of the said sled.

SECTION 5. Every person who shall ride any horse, or drive any gig, chaise, carriage, waggon, cart, truck, sleigh or sled, on any street in any town within this Island, or on any public road or highway within the same, every such person shall always hereafter in meeting any other horse, gig, chaise, carriage, waggon, cart, truck, sleigh or sled, leave the same on his right hand side in passing.

SECTION 6. Whenever any carriage, waggon, cart, truck, sleigh or sled, shall at any time hereafter stop, or be suffered to stand, loaded or unloaded on any of the said streets or highways, every such carriage, waggon, cart, truck, sleigh or sled shall not be placed nearer to the centre of such street or highway than two feet.
