REMARKS.—The nearer the Moon's changes to midnight, the fairer the weather will be during the next seven days; the nearer to mid-day, the rougher and more stormy. The former time occupies from 10 p. m. to 2 a. m. the latter from 10 a. m. to 2 p. m.

- 2. The phases happening from 4 to 10 p. m., may be followed by fair weather, but this chiefly depends upon the direction of the wind.
- 3. If a storm arises from the East, on or immediately preceding the Spring Equinox, or a week after, the following Spring or Summer will be wet four times out of five; if from the West, North or South-west, the Spring and Summer will be dry five times out of six.
