FOREST TREE PLANTING**

OVER 7,000,000 forest trees have been sent out within the past five years by the Department of the Interior to farmers on the prairie and planted according to instructions. Of these over 85 per cent. are living now. The Department is prepared to further assist settlers in this work, but in order to do so it is necessary that application should be sent to the Superintendent of Forestry at Ottawa, as soon as possible by those desiring to have their land examined next season. These applications will receive attention according to the date of their receipt and all applications for inspection next year must be in by March 1st 1907. Simply write a few lines without delay, stating that you wish to make application for trees, and giving your name and post office address and regular forms of application will be sent you. 
