

On Motion of Mr. *Palmer*, *Ordered*, That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor setting forth that the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly have not agreed, as to the appointment of the Colony Agents, and praying that His Excellency together with the President of His Majesty's Council, and the Speaker of this House may be pleased to appoint one or more Persons as Agents for the Colony, and that the Address now presented be adopted. Messrs. *Holland*, *Brecken*, and *E. Coffin*, were appointed a Committee to wait on his Excellency with the same.

Adjourned to six o'clock this evening.

*Wednesday Evening, December 17, 1806.*

THE House met according to Adjournment.

On Motion, *Ordered*, That the Petition of Mr. *John Cambridge*, be now taken into consideration...Petitioner being present was permitted to be heard at the Bar in support of the same.

On Motion of Mr. *Palmer*, *Ordered*, That the said Petition lie over until to-morrow.

Then the House adjourned till ten o'clock to-morrow.

*Thursday, December 18, 1806.*

THE House met according to adjournment.

The order of the day being read, the Petition of Mr. *John Cambridge* was taken into consideration.

*Ordered*, on Motion of Mr. *Palmer*, That the Address to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor do respectfully recommend a reduction of Quit-Rent on Lots 63 and 64, and that they shall stand as if placed on the First Class of the Scale of Composition.

On Motion the following Address was adopted and a Committee appointed to wait on His Excellency therewith.
