On Motion of Mr. Palmer, Ordered, That an humble Addrefs be prefented to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor fetting forth that the Upper and Lower Houfes of Affembly have not agreed as to the appointment of the Colony Agents, and praying that His Excellency together with the Prefident of His Majefty's Council, and the Speaker of this Houfe may be pleafed to appoint one or more Perfons as Agents for the Colony, and that the Addrefs now prefented be adopted. Meffrs. Holland, Brecken, and E. Coffin, were appointed a Committe to wait on his Excellency with the fame.

Adjourned to fix o'clock this evening.

Wednesday Evening, December 17, 1806.

THE Houfe met according to Adjournment.

On Motion, Ordered, That the Petition of Mr. John Cambridge, be now taken into confideration....Petitioner being present was permitted to be heard at the Bar in support of the same.

On Motion of Mr. Palmer, Ordered, That the faid Petition lie over until to-morrow.

Then the House adjourned till ten o'clock to-morrow.

Thursday, December 18, 1806.

HE House met according to adjournment.

The order of the day being read, the Petition of Mr. John Cambridge was taken into confideration.

Ordered, on Motion of Mr. Palmer, That the Address to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor do respectfully recommend a reduction of Quit-Rent on Lots 63 and 64, and that they shall stand as if placed on the First Class of the Scale of Composition.

On Motion the following Address was adopted and a Committee appointed to wait on His Excellency therewith.
