DEAN ABBOTT AT GRACE CHURCH

Inspiring Address to Those Who Are Dispirited With Things.

At Grace Church last night Dean Abbott, M. A., of Christ's Church Hamilton, occupied the pulpit.

Choosing his discourse from the words: "Master we have toiled all the night and taken nothing," with a sermon full of concise and masterly diction, aided by his splendid delivery, he drove home to the people lesson of courage and determination in life's battles. The Sea of Galilee had refused to yield up its riches, the fishers dispirited had beached their boat. Unto them came the Master and Simon answered with faith saying: "Nevertheless at thy word I will let down the nets."

Their success was overwhelming! Drawing his parallel from these circumstances to our daily lives with all its struggles Dean Abbott said: "Thus it is with us all, we have a passion. Not one perhaps that of lust but one mayhap as powerful—

passions bind with golden threads as well as ropes. They have all the diabolical subtlety of their Master, Satan. We try to get the better of ourselves and we fail, till at last we are beached on the shores of hopelessness.

We allow the moral disasters of the past to dictate the fate of tomorrow, and so go on inert, stagnated and spiritless.

The years go on and like the fishers we hear His voice and taking heart let down the nets and hope renewed we turn upwards towards the summits.

The morn, has come! All hail the new born privileges of to-day. Trials are His ministry unto us—by them we learn to live. To rise and fall, to rise and fall again, and again, 'till at

last the light shines clear on the summits we were climbing towards, and we are fit to pass beyond.

The men and women, who roused to this, are the heroes and heroines of our world to-day—take heart and begin again." was his message to those present.
