#### NARROW ESCAPE ON ITALIAN FRONT

American Visiting Isonzo Battle Passed Through Perils.

An Atlantic Port, Oct. 3.—Francis B. Sayre, son-in-law of President from Austrian gunners while visiting a portion of the Isono battle front, early in September, on his arrival here aboard a British steamship. He has spent the past four months in France and Italy in the organization of recreational centres as a representative of the war work

A. officers, Mr. Sayre was visiting the Italian front, when, as their automobile entered a bend in the road, they became the target of six Austrian gunners, he says. Five shells were fired at them, Mr. Sayre stated, the last of which exploded within forty feet of the party. He declared the Italian officers escorting them thrust them back into the automobile in which they were hurried to a place of safety.
