Dr. P. J. Maloney, the Provincial Health Officer, made his annual visit to the House of Industry at Athens on November 27, just at the noon hour. He asked to see what was being served for dinner and said that it was very good.

very good. The manager, Leslie Burnham, and Mrs. Herbert Burnham, matron, took him through the home. He inspected every room from the basement to the dormitories and examined the beds, which he found in a clean, sanitary and comfortable condition. He asked the inmates at Provincial Health Officer, if there were any complaints and none was received.

Dr. Maloney recommended that in-dividual lockers should be installed for the inmates and that suitable ventila-tion be placed in the lavatories. The general cleanliness of the institution he considered satisfactory
