They were badly frightened, but were able to go to another room and bring in a verdict exonerating the C. P. R.

The rest of the ceiling in the damaged chambers is full of cracks and looks as though it were in danger of falling at any moment. The result of the accident will probably be an immediate overhauling of the whole ancient court house.
