It is thought that the thief is making his way towards Chatham. The mare is 14 hands high and is a valuable animal. It is suspected that the thief will try to trade it off or sell it.

Chief Holmes visited all of the livery stables this morning but could get no trace of the missing animal.

L. E. Tillson Says There Will be no Local Trouble Over Anthracite Supply

In reference to the item which appeared in The Planet on Saturday pointing out the difficulties experienced by local coal dealers, L. E. Tillson, of the firm of Tillson & Fleming, gave the following interview to The Planet:

"As you say, hard coal generally drops April 1st, but so far it has remained at the winter price. We have had no trouble, however, in getting what we want. As to soft coal, Chatham is well favored, as the coal manufacturers have contracts with the Lake Erie Coal Co., and we have renewed contracts for 1906, and are supplying their needs as wanted. We have had no trouble so far in getting all the other lines, such as domestic, lump, cannel, smokeless, etc."

BATES WON OUT

The shooting match between Bates and Youngblood, which was held at Windsor on Saturday afternoon, resulted in a victory for the former by 182 birds to 177.

The match was one of the biggest ever held in Canada for live bird shooting and was for a prize of \$200. The number of live birds shot at was 290 and the contest was very even and most exciting. In the first 100 Youngblood secured the lead by 49-38, but in the second half of the match Bates drew ahead and won by five birds. A big crowd was in attendance at the Windsor Driving Park, at which the contest was held.

Thomas Martin, a prominent local contractor, met with a nasty accident on Saturday while putting in some drains in Mr. Jeffrey's new house on Lucero street. 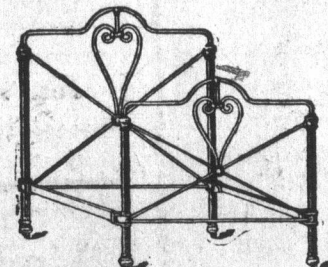
