MEETING IN MARCHESTER.
[CONTINUED FROM OUR LAST.]

Now here is the difficulty of returning to the expenditure of 1857! Why the whole question lies in the amount of your warlike armaments. The whole question is, will the Government be content to waste ten millions in unproductive services like your fighting establishments,—I mean fighting establishments in the time of peace? Will your Government be content with ten millions? and if not, why not? I want the arguments: why not? I was asked the other day by a member of Parliament, "When are you going into the details, to show how you are to carry on the Government upon your plan?"
