What is granted by the Hay-Paunceforte Treaty is the use, occupation and control of canal law the Panama is still sovereign of the Canal Zone. The consequence of this limited tenure is that in the Canal Zone, the States is legally just much a foreign state as any other foreign state and that if it exercise sovereignty in Panama, it can do so only within the limits as defined by the treaty. 
