

pecial to Evening Telegram. HALIFAX, Jan. 13. The Royal Mail Packet Cobequid,

on her initial trip between St. John, N.B., Halifax and the West Indies, sent out a wireless at 8.30 this morning, saying she was ashore at Briar Island and asking for assistance. The light keeper has failed to locate the Cobequid after a careful search. Marine authorities think she may have struck Grand Manan instead of Briar Island. A theory is that she struck off Grand Manan at low water, and that when the tide came up she was submerged, all on board perishing. Besides 87 of a crew there were five passengers, said to be colored people from Bermuda, bound for Halifax or are: Commander, J. Couson, R.N.R.: Chief Officer, F. W. Kirny; 2nd Officer, W. F.
