German Victrix.

The puzzle of the German mind ever grows. Recent disclosures leave us hopelessly struggling with the question whether the far famed Teutonic sense of humor has hatched out an "unseasonable epidemic or whether the "Tritschke bacillus has developed a fit of national delirium. The outgivings of eight leading newspapers of the Empire, cabled from Berlin to the New York Sun, read to American eyes like samples of madcap irony devised by enemies of the Fatherland to bring ridicule and discredit upon its hopes. Yet it would seem these things are thought out seriously, printed seriously and intended to be taken seriously not only by Germans but by the world at large. Strangest of all, surprise will be expressed by Germans at the fact that neutral opinion is almost universally unsympathetic if not hostile to Germany.

Auto-intoxicated by the idea of the Serbian drive and the parade to Constantinople, the German press has taken up with jubilation the topic not of peace but of "definite victory." It is already rearranging the world. This is to be effected with true Prussian modesty and moderation. The Reinisch-Westfalsche Zeitung obligingly outlines the new distribution of the earth:

Austria to annex the greater part of Serbia; Belgium to become definitely German, with the exception of a small corner, which Holland will be allowed to occupy.

France to be deprived of her fortified places.
Russia to lose Finland, the Baltic provinces, Bessarabia, Poland, the Crimea and portions of the Caucasus.
England must abandon her Mediterranean possessions as well as Egypt and practically all of her colonies. India to become a semi-independent State under German protection.

The penalty to be inflicted on poor old Uncle Sam is not specified. Perhaps the surrender of Alaska, the Philippines, Guam, our Samoan pos-

sessions, Porto Rico and the control of the Panama Canal may suffice and we shall not be asked to relinquish Florida, Long Island and Maine. We hope for the best.

The strange thing is that this felicitation should be made just at the present time when, really, nothing seems to be going very well with Germany. Take the newspapers from Sunday to to-day. We find that the Balkan enterprise advances at a rate of less than two miles a day, while France and England are throwing tens of thousands of men into this theatre of war and Russia will join in next week. We find that Russia is holding back in one region and beating her back in another. We find Germany dashing wildly against the Franco-British lines in the west to recoup her recent defeats with no results save terrible losses of men. We find Italy at last making substantial advances. We find British submarines stopping Germany's supplies from Sweden and sinking her cruisers in the Baltic. We find Germany cutting off meat supplies for her population two days a week. We are told that her soldiers are no longer well fed. We are told she can no longer find men to continue her activity on all the war fronts.

There is something strange certainly in the psychology which selects this conjuncture for a defiance of the universe so brutal as to stimulate the enemy to even greater efforts than ever before, lest by any chance the dire threats so ferociously uttered should come within the possibility of realization.—American paper.

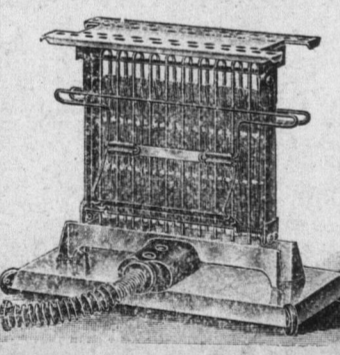
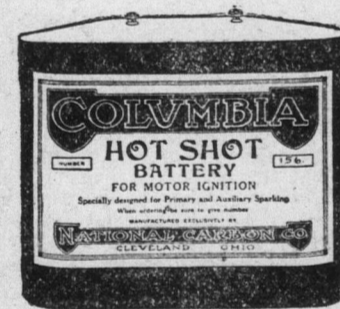
