

Watches Bigger Than Saucers.

The Emperor Charles V., for instance, had one which weighed 27 lb. The watches of that day were very much like ordinary clocks. They were cylindrical in shape, finely chased, and had a hinged lid on one side

A costly and elaborate watch was made for Sultan Abdul-Medjid by Messrs. Hart and Son, of Cornhill, in 1844. It was made of 22 carat gold and was 5 in. in diameter. It chimed the hours and quarters but was without a bell, the striking parts being made up of wires. It possessed a powerful and resonant tone, was exceptionally harmonious, and sounded like a cathedral clock. Twelve hundred guineas was its cost.
