## Terra Nova Arrives.

## HAILS FOR 23,000.

The S. S. Terra Nova, Captain A.  
Kean, with all flags flying steamed in-  
to port yesterday at 3.45 p. m., four  
hours after the arrival of the S. S.  
Neptune. Although bringing the bay  
as far as the first are concerned, Capt.  
Kean is high liner, and hails for  
23,000 seals, or the weight of 33,000  
young. The Terra Nova left here on  
March 8th, and steamed North to  
about 50 miles N. N. E. of the Funks,  
where an impenetrable jam was en-  
countered. Finding that further pro-  
gress could not be made, Capt. Kean  
decided to retreat and on March 12th  
whilst steaming back he passed a small  
patch of hoods. On Monday 13th, the  
first white coats were spotted and 30  
were taken on board. Next morning  
the ship worked into the fat and the  
work of killing began. Owing to  
heavy ice the ship could not manoeuvre  
about and the crew had to make long  
hauls. The Sagons, Eagle, and Nep-  
tune were also in the vicinity. How-  
ever Captain Kean secured 15,  
000 out of the patch before it was  
cleared up. This was practically the  
only body of seals met for the Spring  
and since then the Terra Nova has  
been after the old fat, of which 7,000  
has been secured. When coming  
south on Sunday last the ship passed  
through thousands of beaters. Captain  
Kean says he never saw such large  
numbers at any time during the past  
10 years. The ship is now at Bow-  
ling's South side premises where she  
is discharging.
