THE LATE SESSION. The session of the Legislature of Ontario which has just ended has been the remarkable in two particulars; first in ed the moderation which marked the debates, and the calmness which reigned over the deliberations of its members: and second, in the small amount of legislation that has been done for the Province as a whole, and the large amount affecting private individuals

or particular bodies. To the desire to give the new con stitution every opportunity of demonstrating its efficiency, and realizing the happy results that were anticipated from it, the first of these characteristics is to be attributed. Reformers and Conservatives alike knew that they were experimenting with certain legal machinery, the suitability of which many had not hesitated to question, and that it behooved them to exercise the utmost caution. Thus it came to pass that if there was not always concerted action between the government and the Opposition (as it is not to be supposed there would be), there were far fewer contests for party predominance, far less bitter personal strife, far less of recrimination, and a great deal more forgetfulness of self and mindfulness of the country than we have witnessed for years. The harmony which we have beheld during the session is certainly a good omen for the future. The two subjects of our loudest complaint under the union between Upper and Lower Canada were the incessant wrangling of parties for sectional or personal aggrandizement and power; and the extravagant expenditure of the public Under Confederation the first of the grievances has been removed, and so long as Confederation and the Local House stand so long wil we have no cause of complaint on this point, for there are now no diverse in terests to enter into contention-what is for the weal of one inhabitant of Ontario is for the weal of all. Our Local Legislature has thus demon strated its ability to perform what the old House of Assembly could never hope to accomplish, that is, to deal fair ly with local questions, and to fail in carrying through any measure having reference to the Province, not from a: opposition rendered strong and bitter by jealousy, but because of a firm, le gically deduced conviction on the parof a majority that the measure woul not be of benefit to the public.
