Dr. J. S. McKay, of Detroit, Nearly Loses His Own Life in Saving Another.

As he approached the sinking man he Irwin lost his life. warned him not to grab hold, but as he went under he caught a deathly grip of the doctor, who had no chance of breaking away except by kicking the sinking man in the chest. After freeing himself he again went back and brought the man to shore amid the cheers of frightened spectators.

#### WIMAN IN JAIL.

Ready to Make an Appeal as Soon as Sentenced-Mr. Wiman's Friends

Do Not Desert Him. NEW YORK, June 17 .- Gen. B. F. Tracey said yesterday that Wiman's case would be appealed. "We can do nothing," he added, "for Mr. Wiman until after he is sentenced on June 20. We will serve notice of an appeal on Judge Ingraham, then Mr. Wiman can be bailed until the matter of an appeal is settled."

Mr. Wiman, who occupied cell No. 4 in the lower tier of the Tombs prison, was one of the busiest and apparently one of the happiest of men to be found in the city to-day. He arose early after a good night's rest and ate a hearty breaklast. Soon telegrams began to arrive, three and four at a time. The morning mail brought a bundle of about 50 letters addressed to Mr. Wiman. They came from all parts of this country and many from Canada. The letters and telegrams all expressed sympathy, confidence, and contained words of encouragement and some of them offers of material aid. One, from one of the largest contractors in Montreal, reads: 'Although I have not the honor of your personal acquaintance, I respectfully tender you my sincerest sympathy in a condition which I believe to be the result of an abominable persecution. Permit me to

offer any material aid in my power." Rev. J. Johnson and P. Johnson, sons of the Venerable Archdeacon Johnson, of Christ Church in New Brighton, S. I., and the church's quartet came this afternoon to read the evening service and preach and sing for Mr. Wiman. Mr. Wiman has been connected with the church for 30 years and is one of its vestrymen. The service was read in the body of the old prison, and all of the prisoners were permitted to hear it. The singing of the quartet was more like that of a jubilee than condolence. Many friends came from Staten Island to visit Mr. Wiman, and some of them attended the service in the jail. His devoted wife sent many loving messages by her sons, William Dwight Wiman and Frank P. Wiman.

Matrimonial Frauds. (From the London Pall Mall Gazette.) Dear Sir,-I wish in all earnestness to make known a suggestion that would save many a broken heart among the sensitive and many a breach of promise case among the mercantile, and would considerably lighten the labors of the police courts and law courts. My suggestion is that every married man and every married woman should have a circle tationed around the third finger of the left hand in place of or as well as a wedding ring. This would be a sign that could never be taken off or effaced and would therefore leave a lesser margin, for the treacheries and tricks of

bigamists and other great and small offenses against law, society and individuals. To make this proposition practical and distinctive, of course certain rules would have to be made. For instance, any unmarried man or woman tattooing their third finger to be heavily fined. Every widow and widower to add a distinguishing star to their ring. Every married man or woman disunited by law to have a bar of erasure across their wedding ring, and those who marry two or three times to add

the extra circles accordingly. The operation of tattooing could, with all reverence, be performed by an expert in the vestry after the church service, or at the registrar's office for those who only go through the civil ceremony. This tattoo. ing may seem a return to barbarism, but our much-vaunted civilization has introduced such numerous aids to deceit that a safeguard and a warning, such as a tattooed wedding ring would become a practical preventative of much sham, folly and

wrong. Only those who have sympathy for unawful liberty will demur against the idea being realized. I shall be pleased to hear from all who approve of my scheme and are willing to assist in forming a society to influence others in bringing about a custom that would help to insure peace, respect and happiness to many homes and hearts. ## Stuck in the Sand.

London, June 17 .- The North German Lloyd steamer Stuttgart, from Bremen for Baltimore, with 500 passengers and a cargo of cement, went ashore at 6 o'clock this morning half a mile east of Start Point, coast of Devonshire. There was a dense fog and the steamer had been run at half speed for hours. The moment land was seen ahead the engines were reversed and were run full speed astern. Nevertheless the vessel grounded heavily on the sandy beach between two rocks. After she remained afloat. It was high water, and the cargo was shifted aft as rapidly as possible for the purpose of lifting her bow off the bottom, but she remained fast. Tugs which were summoned from Plymouth stood by her all day. About midafternoon the North German Lloyd steamer Gera was signaled and came to the relief of the Stuttgart and pulled her off without damage. At 7 o'clock she and the Gera sailed away together.

A SCIENTIST suggests the use of an alloy of gold and aluminium for the making of money. He says that counterfeiting would be almost impossible, as the only alloy which can be made successfully consists of 78 parts of gold to 22 of aluminium. The product is said to be of a beautiful purple color, with ruby reflections that cannot be imitated.
