DA'S CONTINUE TO BRING HIGH PRICES

Chicago, March 24.—Cattle—Receipts, 3,000; market steady, \$7 10 to \$8 00; western steers, \$7 25 to \$8 25; stockers and feeders, \$5 05 to \$8 10; cows and heifers, \$3 75 to \$8 75. Hogs—Receipts, 11,000; market strong; light, \$8 65 to \$9 90; mixed, \$8 60 to \$8 87 1/2; heavy, \$8 65 to \$8 85; rough, \$8 40 to \$8 55; pigs, \$7 10 to \$8 70; bulk of sales at \$8 70 to \$8 85.

Because there has been a large supply of hay on the market for several days, the demand was slow Tuesday. There were about thirty loads weighed, and sold around \$13.50, with \$14 per ton the highest price paid.

Winipeg, March 23.—Wheat prices were steady but the greater part of the day on the Winnipeg market and trading quiet, a light volume of business being transacted.

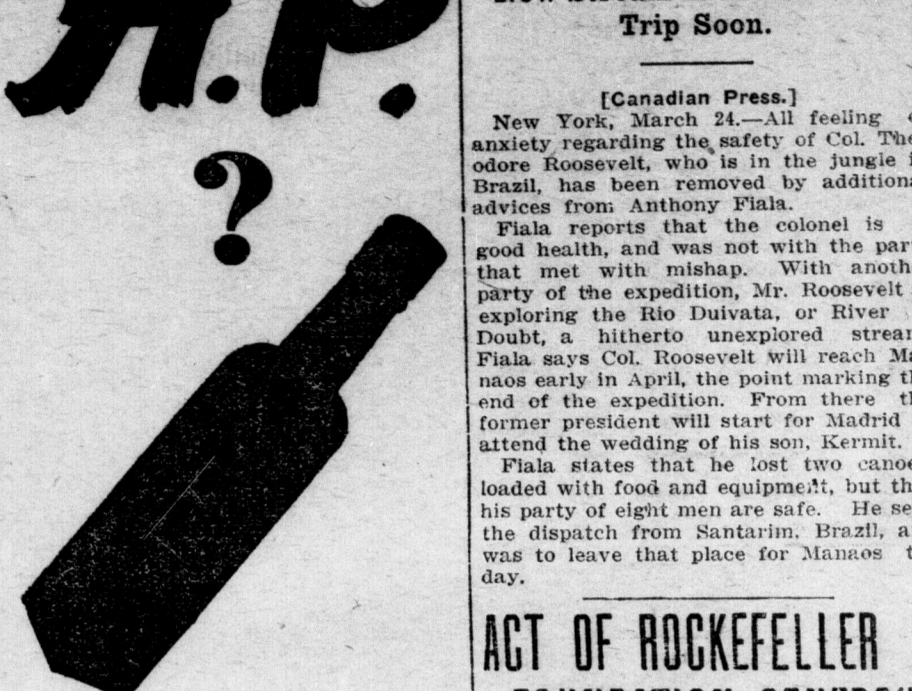
