BARONWOOD WINS SAGINAW 2:19 PACE IN STRAIGHT HEATS

Not Troubled After the First Heat, When He Noses Out Marion Ashley.

SAGINAW, Mich., Aug. 16.—Two favorites went down to defeat this afternoon at the second day of the Short-horse meeting, the racing being hard, and the time better.

One of the big surprises was in the second division of the 2:19 pace, in which Marion Ashley figured best. She led in the first heat until the stretch, where Baronwood came up and beat her a nose. After that Baronwood was well within himself at the end of each mile, none of the others being able to touch him.

The clever little mare, Pearl Thorn, upset calculations in the 2:25 trot, where Belle McLee was the final favorite. Pearl Thorn beat all times and won handsily. Haley C. the favorite, started off like a runaway in the first division of the 2:19 pace. She pocketed two heats, where Miss McLee slipped through on the pole and beat her in the third. Haley C. was game, and raced Miss Preble into submission in the fourth heat.

PREMIER HAS NO WORD OF ONTARIO DELEGATION

Nothing Known at Ottawa of Move Against Sir Sam.
