It is a well recognized fact that nearly all instances where work in the public interest is required to be done, it devolves upon those whose time is really the most in demand in their own personal affairs to make the sacrifice.

After an address by His Worship the Mayor, one of the pleasantest functions of the evening took place. This was the presentation by Mayor Murray of the Governor General's medal to Miss Hazel Langley, who was the winner last year in this county. MicMacs of Maritime Provinces Hold Fete at St. Restigouche

MANY PRESENT

There was a great gathering of the Micmac Indians Friday and Sunday at the mission of St. Anne de Restigouche to celebrate the tercentenary of the baptism of twenty-one members of the tribe, with their chief, Member Tou, which ceremony occurred June 24th, 1610, at Port Royal, Nova Scotia.

Representative Micmacs were present at the demonstrations from different parts of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island, as well as Quebec, Bishop Bala, Mr. Bismontski, in whose diocese St. Anne de Restigouche is situated, conducted the Pontifical Mass, Father Pacific and Chief Denay of Cape Breton delivering an address.
